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## Endowment Lecture by Prof. C.N.R. Rao

World renowned scientist and recipient of the Bharat Ratna award **Prof. CNR Rao** delivered the endowment lecture on Monday, September 18 at Fr L F Rasquinha Hall, St Aloysius College (Autonomous) Mangaluru. Rev. Fr Dionysius Vas SJ, Rector of St Aloysius Institutions presided over the function. Rev. Dr Praveen Martis SJ, Principal of St Aloysius College, Rev. Fr Pradeep Sequeira SJ, Finance Officer, Dr A M Narahari, Registrar and Dr Ronald Nazareth, the convener were present.

Prof. Rao conferred the Star Status to St Aloysius College (Autonomous) in the presence of the dignitaries. The college is the only co-educational institution in Karnataka, and one of the 16 colleges in the entire country till date to be conferred with this status. He also inaugurated the 'Prof CNR Rao Instrumentation Center' at the premises, to facilitate research in the discipline of physi-



cal science. Prof. Rao was felicitated, and was presented with a Note of Appreciation.

In his address, Prof. Rao stressed that an educational institution must provide an appropriate atmosphere to fuel one's creative genius. "Examinations have destroyed education in India. Education isn't an important thing. Examinations certainly are", he remarked, stating that teaching is an art. An atmosphere of science is imperative to inculcate creativity in young minds. "The future belongs to the young, and we must serve them", he stated. "Seventy million children in our villages need good, rewarding education. Else, the nation will succumb to anarchy. The future depends on whether we can do something beyond our call of duty". His succinct address consisted of anecdotes about his inspirations in life – his mother, Sir C V Raman, and Michael Faraday. "Without

failure, success has no meaning", he opined. Commenting upon the college's reputation as an institution committed to producing men and women for others, he suggested implementing extensively multidisciplinary courses



es to ensure that interested students are benefited. "Inspiration doesn't always require understanding. My first reaction to the wonders of science was awe, followed by hard work", he said, answering a query posed by a member of the audience. "Today, chemists can put their expertise to use in the frontiers of science by finding specific cures for cancer, solving the energy crisis and combating environmental pollution", he extolled. Rev. Fr Dionysius Vas SJ, Rector of St Aloysius Institutions delivered the Presidential address, remarking, "We are not cisterns for holding, but channels for sharing.

Prof Rao has contributed immensely to science by simplifying concepts in his books."

## Seminar on "Applied Nano Technology"

**D**epartment of Post Graduate Studies and Research in Chemistry in association with DDU Kaushal Kendra of St Aloysius (Autonomous) College organised a seminar on "Applied Nano Technology" September 21<sup>st</sup>, 2017. Nanotechnology is one of the new and fastest growing areas of research in Science and Engineering. This subject is multidisciplinary in nature and possesses the potential to resolve many of the world's major crisis in agriculture, electronics, energy, environmental health and various other issues. The aim of the seminar was to review the current knowledge one possessed in the field of Nano science and technology along with their novel applications and challenges. Scientists, Research Scholars, Undergraduate and Post graduate Teachers and Students in the field of Chemistry, Physics, Material Science, Food Science, Bioscience, Biomedical Science and Engineering were invited for the seminar.

The seminar was inaugurated by the eminent scientist



and a practicing Nanotechnologist Prof V. Lakshminarayanan, Soft condensed Matter Laboratory, Raman Research Institute, Bengaluru. In his inaugural address he focussed on the need to promote innovation among the young minds to bring about research in the field of science and technology. He said that nanotechnology was an emerging field and it was due to the constant observation by various scientists that the new field emerged. He inspired the young students to take up this interdisciplinary research which had limitless applications.

The programme was presided over by the Principal of the college Rev Dr Praveen Martis SJ who quoted Dr Richard Feynman's famous words pertaining to nanotechnology that there was plenty of place at the bottom, indicating the immense scope in the vast unexplored miniature world invisible to naked eye. Furthermore he referred to the young students that the future of nanotechnology rested on their shoulder and that one must go beyond the textbook knowledge and reasoning. They must question the facts and cultivate curiosity towards the unknown. He urged that the future where nanotechnology could be implemented in the day to day life of a common man was close at hand. He reviewed the current state of knowledge in the field of Nano science and technology along with their applications and challenges.

The inaugural was followed by the key note address on Nanomaterial for electrochemical energy conversion and sensor applications by Prof V. Lakshminarayanan. The professor promoted the need to develop Indian made

instruments which would be implemented in research. He stated the example of CV Raman the pride of India, a noble laureate who developed his own spectrometer to validate his work which later came to be known as the Raman Effect. He addressed that Raman not only had the passion but was also clever wherein he immediately sent his work to the leading minds of the time which gave him an edge over the other contemporaries work-



ing on the same effect. Thus he concluded that one must also have a killer instinct to succeed in the world of research.

Dr Ronald Nazareth, coordinator of Star College Scheme and HOD of Post Graduate department of studies and research in Chemistry welcomed the gathering, the Vice Principal and the Director of DDU Kaushal Kendra Dr Richard Gonsalves had introduced the chief guest while the Convenor Dr Adarsh Gowda delivered the vote of thanks. The Organizing Secretary Dr John Deepak D'Souza and Rev Dr Leo D'Souza were also present during the programme.

The second session was conducted by Dr Aditya Nayak, Engineering, Marie Curie Fellow (Scientist) Microstructure Engineering Research Group, School of Chemical Engineering, University of Birmingham, United Kingdom, on the topic Pickering particles: Novel Tools for Food Microstructure Engineering. In afternoon the ses-



sion was on Nanotechnology in Food Packaging and Food Safety: Antimicrobials, barrier materials and sensors by Dr Chandra Prabha M.N Professor, Department of Biotechnology M S Ramaiah Institute of Technology, Bangalore.

Each of the sessions the floor was open for discussion wherein the students as well as the staff participated enthusiastically. The prayer was led by Ms Priyanka and team from the post graduate department of chemistry.

## National Seminar on Wildlife Conservation and Management

**D**epartment of Zoology hosted a National Seminar on Wildlife Conservation and Management on 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup>



September 2017 at St Aloysius College. About 320 delegates including students, staff and research scholars from various institutes had registered. The programme was inaugurated by Sri Sanjay Gubbi by unveiling the portrait of Fr Joseph Anchieta, a renowned Jesuit wild life Conservationist, Unveiling *Euphlyctis aloysii* a frog species named after the college by Dr Hareesh Joshi and the release of the book of abstracts.

The keynote address was delivered by the Chief Guest Sri Sanjay Gubbi, Wildlife Biologist and Conservationist, nature Conservation Foundation. His talk highlighted the behaviors of elephants and Gaurs. Further the methodology for census, study of habitat and home range of leopards, tigers was explained. He wined his talk with videos where he and his team captured a leopard in human habitat in Bengaluru. He emphasized on never to lose spirit in life.

The second session was engaged by Dr Samad Kottur, Naturalist, Wildlife Activist and Honorary President of North Karnataka (Birders) Network on Conservation of Sloth Bears in Daroji Sanctuary Ballari-Human Wildlife Conflict. A remarkable activist to stop bear crime in the entire South India. The Gudekote bera sanctuary was established through his persistent efforts. His session threw light on the habitat and food requirements of Sloth bear.

Session three was engaged up by Dr Manoj Borkar, Head of the Department of Zoology, Carmel College for Women, Goa University on Behavior and Conservation concerns of Synanthropic prides of Asiatic Lion in Coastal Saurashtra of Gujarat. He delt on the distribution of lion across the globe and India in particular, methods used in identification of lions, behavioral and adaptational changes compared to native population.

The fourth session was by Sri Sammilan Shetty, Founder, Butterfly Park, Balvai, Moodabidri on butterfly diversity and conservation. He spoke on the life cycle of butterflies, their importance and threats to them. He also showed several photographs and videos of various species of butterflies from his very own butterfly park. Second day, the first session was by Dr Krishna Mohan, Practicing Surgeon and Wildlife Activist, Moodabidri on Diversity and Conservation of Birds and Spiders. He explained about various species of birds including endemic, migrations, exotic and several other kinds found

in the Western Ghats. His also spoke on spiders, their families their special characters.

The next session was by the 'frog man of India' Prof. S D Biju, department of Environmental Studies, Systematics Lab, University of Delhi. He has discovered more than hundred species of frogs. He spoke on importance of amphibians and threats due to human interventions.

The next session was by Ms Aparna Kolekar, Associate, Nature Conservation Foundation, Bengaluru on Corridors and Impact of roads on wildlife. She explained on ecosystem fragmentation due to road construction and the increased mortality of wild animals due to the same. Further she spoke on corridors, various types and importance of protection of these from human interventions.

The last session was by Mr Santhosh Pavaghada, Associate, Nature Conservation Foundation, Bengaluru on



Conservation outreach and participation of Youth. He explained the logical and inspiring methods used in creating awareness and sensitizing general public regarding wildlife conservation.

The seminar was concluded by a formal valedictory programme.

### GST Symposium-Trickling Through The Transition

The PG Department of Business Administration at AIMIT, Beeri, St Aloysius College (Autonomous) organized a One Day Symposium on GST: Trickling through the Transition on September 21, 2017 at the Arthur Shenoi Auditorium.

With the press of a button at midnight in Parliament's Central Hall, India switched to GST, the single biggest tax reform undertaken by the country in 70 years of independence. The Goods and Service Tax is an indirect taxation wherein most of the existing taxes will be merged into a single taxation system. GST is purported to bring in the 'one nation one tax' system.

The inaugural commenced with the lighting the lamp by the dignitaries. Dr Rowena Wright, the Dean welcomed and introduced the chief resource person Prof. Dr. Victor Louis Anthuvan.

Rev Fr. Denzil Lobo, the Director, AIMIT gave a brief introduction on the operational lacunae in the area of GST implementation. He related the past and the present economic scenario of the country in the area of taxation.



Prof. Dr Victor Louis Anthuvan, Professor of Finance, Chairperson PhD Programme Loyola Institute of Business Administration, Chennai, graced the occasion as the Chief Guest. In his key address to the students, Dr Anuthuvan in his inimitable style and through his powerful intellect took the gathering all the way down ages detailing our Indian culture and reminding the audience of what we stand for. He exhorted the future managers to replace rejuvenate and relive the glory of India which it had more than 2500 years ago and which was gradually looted and slowly overcome only some four hundred years ago. He also maintained that the present implementation of GST has the potential to spearhead the progress of the Indian economy. An increase in taxes would give the Govt. the much needed inflow of capital for developmental projects, he maintained. By 2060, India would gear up to be the richest country if it consistently meets the growth rate of 8%, he commented.

The second session was held by a vibrant Chartered Accountant Mr Kiran Vasanth who addressed the gathering on the topic: GST and the Common man.

Dr Rowena Wright, the Dean, Dr Beena Dais, the Faculty Coordinator, Mr Anup Acharya, Management Club Secretary were present at the occasion. The symposium was truly a day of meaningful learning and discussion for students at AIMIT.

## Manasa Manthana 2017- A National level business plan contest

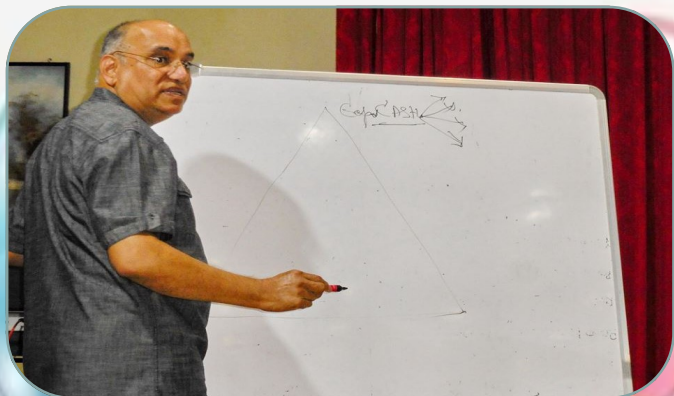

It provides a means of understanding, analyzing and talking about the design and construction of the organization as an integrated, complex composition of many interconnected systems (human and non-human) that need to work together for the whole to function successfully.

## Warehouse Modelling

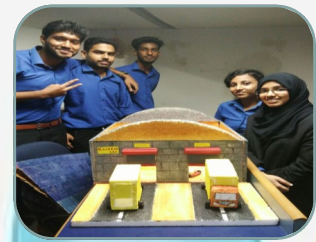

## B Voc Students Visited KMF

On 23<sup>rd</sup> September 2017 the students of 2<sup>nd</sup> year B.Voc Food processing and engineering, St Aloysius College, Mangalore along with the lecturers visited KMF (Karnataka Milk Federation) which is located at Kulshekar in Mangalore. The purpose behind visiting the industry was to know and understand the technological



processes involved in the manufacturing of the milk and its products. The DKMU has its 14 unions all over the Karnataka State. The DKMU has got a wide range of milk distribution units in the state and is a well known milk industry with dozens of products, well equipped machines and also with dedicated employees. At present, the industry is known for its products like Milk, Flavored milk, Butter, Ghee, Paneer, Peda, Buttermilk, Lassi, UHT treated milk, Khova, Nandini bites etc which was made available in different proportions such as 500ml, 1liter, 50gms etc. The factory follows GMP, GHP, Standard Regulations of FSSAI, ISO 22000 and HACCP to ensure the food safety.

On our visit to the industry the process of manufacturing milk and its products were explained to us by the factory employee. The factory follows certain hygiene and sanitation practices by asking the visitors to wash and sanitise their hands. At first we were explained about the collection of milk from the society and the various platform tests to check for adulteration. The milk is brought to the factory by maintaining the desired temperature and safety of the milk. The milk is collected in a tank and then tested for its odour, clot on boil, and also rapid platform tests are performed to check the fat present. The milk after receiving is stored in a dump tank, where it is chilled and stored in horizontal milk storage tank. Before the milk is subjected to the process of pasteurization, it is tested for a set of bacteria. For the process of pasteurization the temperature is set to 70°C for 15 seconds which is then rapidly cooled to 4°C so as to attain complete pasteurization. Before the process of pasteurization, the milk is subjected to homogenization where the milk fats are broken down into fine molecules.

The cream is separated from the milk to obtain butter and ghee and the skimmed milk is obtained. The industry produces different variety of milk based on the percentage of fat and SNF content. The fat content in milk ranges from 3% to 6.1% and SNF from 8.5% to 9%. The price is dependent of the content of fat in it. Higher the fat content, higher is the price. The pasteurized milk is

the passed to the packing session and the temperature is maintained thought the process. The samples are taken from each lot for the assessment.

In the packaging section, the packing materials are coded and passed through UV light to ensure sterilization of the packaging materials. The milk is then filled into the packing materials and sealed. They are then arranged into trays and passed to the storage unit. The packed milk is stored in a chiller room in which the temperature is set below 0°C and -18°C for butter.

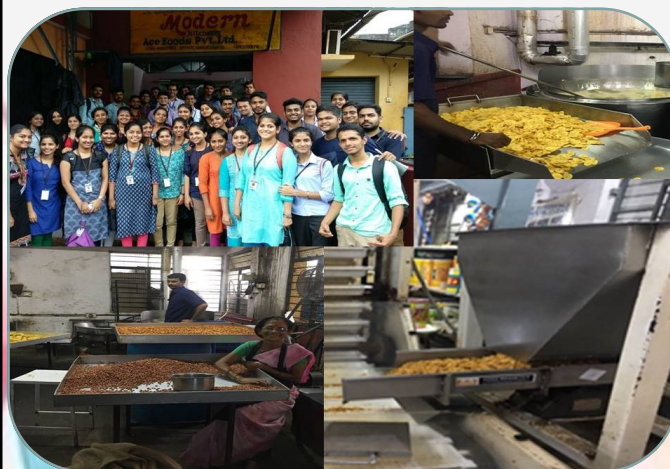
The industry also carries out the production of UHT milk where the milk is treated to a temperature of 140-142°C for about 24 seconds. This process is done in aseptic condition by using HEPA filters. The hygiene is maintained by the employees by wearing head caps and separate suitable clothing.

The industry also produces flavored milk where the temperature is maintained at 121°C for sterilization of the milk. Usually permitted artificial flavors are added to produce flavored milk. It is then capped and sealed and later stored at low temperature. Finally, we assembled in a hall where the Deputy Manager Mr. Hemanth explained us the whole process once again in detail and the session was open for discussion which was very informative. Refreshments were served and we shall cherish their hospitality.

## MBA Students visit to Modern Kitchens

The first industrial Visit for the academic year 2017-2018 was organized for the students of MBA. A total of 60 students visited Modern Kitchens, Yeyyadi under the guidance of Mr Ravi Kudtarkar and Mr Royce Baretto.

The manager of the industry guided us through the processes. He showed us the entrance which had the segregation work being done. Since it is a chips manufacturing company, the process involved peeling bananas to produce chips as their final output. The peeled bananas were then placed in a slicing machine which were then



transferred manually to the fryer. Also the manufacturing unit has additional products like masala chickpeas and groundnuts.

**F**inal Year B.Com 'A' Batch 62 students were taken to CAMPCO Chocolate Factory Limited Puttur as part of their Industrial Exposure.

The Industrial Visit enabled the students to know the things practically through interaction. The exposure helped the students to know more about the working of the CAMPCO Factory Limited and its various functions. Besides they also came across the manufacturing, marketing and other pro-

# Education system should make youths creative: C N R Rao

Calls upon teachers to inculcate scientific temper in students

DH 19-9-17  
MANGALURU: The current system of education in the country needs to focus on making young students develop creativity and work beyond their capabilities, eminent scientist Prof C N R Rao said on Monday.

He was delivering an endowment lecture at St Aloysius College here.  
Prof Rao, the honorary president of the Jawahar Nehru Centre for Advanced Scientific Research, Bengaluru, said teachers had the challenge to touch effectively in the present age of information explosion. They should go beyond the call of duty and encourage students to inculcate the passion for science rather than make students mug up the subjects. The approach towards real science must be improved. The majority of the teachers would go by the curriculum alone. The institutions must create an atmosphere to make the learning process more creative, he said and gave the example of institutions in the west that had succeeded in this direction.

**Lack of teachers**  
Lamenting that many schools do not have teachers and therefore millions of children are deprived of education at a tender age, Prof Rao said young students should take inspiration from scientists like Michael Faraday who had just

three years of formal schooling. Faraday showed that passion is everything, he added.  
Similarly, at the graduate level, students should be given opportunities to conduct research in science rather than being trained in taking exams.

The Bharat Ratna awardee calls upon autonomous institutions such as St Aloysius College to come up with a flexible curriculum where BZC (biology, zoology, chemistry) students could learn mathematics while PCM (physics, chemistry, maths) students could take biology as an optional subject.

Prof Rao recommended education in the mother tongue till class 10. To another question, he said science and spirituality did not contradict each other and that artificial intelligence could never overtake human intelligence.  
**Certificate to college**  
On the occasion, Prof Rao handed over the certificate of 'Stal Status' to St Aloysius

**'Funds meagre for science research'**  
India spends just 0.9% of its GDP on scientific research, Prof C N R Rao said and called for more funds towards the crucial segments such as health research that could improve the quality of life.  
At present, the funding for health research is Rs 1,500 crore, which is inadequate. It is also necessary to increase the budgetary allocation for the IITs, Prof Rao said and stressed having a policy on the cultivation of genetically modified crops. He added that the government should take a liberal stand on genetic modification.

He was speaking at a seminar 'Gauri Lankesh Nenapu Mattu Abhivyakthi Avalokana' organised by Daurjanya Virodhi Vedike at St Aloysius College on Monday.

Shivasundar said Gauri wrote on the issues related to Constitutional values and sacrificed her life for them. Her life was always a fight, he said.

Recalling his association with Gauri, he said he was part of the team headed by her, which was making efforts to bring Maoists into the mainstream of the society. The team had met the chief minister sev-

eral times. Despite getting offers to be an MLC, she rejected it, he remembered.

He said those who speak truth have been facing threat from corporate lobbyists. The freedom of expression is in peril. Since May 23, 2014 to May 20, 2017, 53 journalists have been murdered, he said.

Inaugurating the programme, Akkamahadevi Women's University, Vijayapura, VC Dr Sabiha Bhoomigowda said that Gauri did not subscribe to any type of 'ism'. Her simplicity inspired all. She was much concerned towards the less privileged, she said.

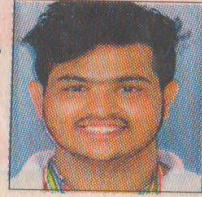

## 'First understand human-animal conflict, then plan steps'

'A proper understanding from different perspectives must'

Wildlife biologist and a member of the Karnataka Wildlife Board Sanjay Gubbi said here on Wednesday that if human-animal conflict was to be addressed effectively, a proper understanding of the conflict from different perspectives is needed.

Delivering the keynote address at a seminar on "Wildlife conservation and management", organised by St. Aloysius College, he said that it was a complicated issue.

Giving an example, he said that a leopard was frequently attacking chicken in a village near Doddaballapur. When investigated, it was found that the improper disposal of carcasses by a poultry farm in the village was the reason for this.

As the carcasses were disposed of in an open area in the village, the leopard developed the habit of consuming them, and started frequenting the village in search of disposal of carcasses would have helped avoid this conflict, he said.

He said that the type of conflict is different for different species of animals. The reasons for which elephants get into conflict with human beings are different from those of related to leopards, sloth bears or tigers.

First, there is a need to understand the types of conflicts, and then plan short-term and long-term measures. When a participant pointed out the crudeness in handling wild animals by villagers and others when the latter entered human habitat, he said that one of the endeavours of the board is to handle the situation by training front-line staff in Forest Department. "This will help them handle the situation in a more methodical manner, he said.

## 'Best students not taking up teaching profession'

There is a severe scarcity of committed and qualified educators/teachers as the best students prefer to take up engineering, MBA, MBBS or such lucrative professional courses, opined Jesuit Educational Association of South Asia Secretary (New Delhi) Rev Fr Sunny Jacob.

Addressing heads of institutions at a seminar on "Challenges and Opportunities of Catholic Education in India - A Critical Response", organised by Sylvester Treacy Franks (STF) Foundation at St. Aloysius College here on Tuesday, Rev Fr Sunny Jacob said that most of the teachers who had lined up in teaching profession in schools/colleges were not really interested in educating students.

Learning is the aim, but the goal for many," he said and added that it can be remedied only when one takes initiatives to teach staff about liberal values and revision of Catholic education. Expressing concern over the growing communalism, he said that the ruling elite, over-land and greedy, promote an intricate mix of a neo-liberal corporate agenda and a narrow majoritarian nationalist agenda, that undermines India's secular democratic traditions and Constitutional values.

Stating that textbooks have been changed to propagate an ideology and spread hatred, he regretted that the rule of law has been compromised with "Freedom of expression is under threat as voices of dissent are silenced by the treat of cases of sedition or other kinds of litigation," he said and added that civil society is also being silenced by various restrictions.
