There is need to create mental ambience: Prof. Viveka Rai at Sarang Decennial valedictory
Renowned Kannada and Tulu scholar Prof. B A Viveka Rai has said that there is a need today to create mental



ambience in a world where mind is being constantly fed with anxiety, fear and animosity. He was speaking at the closing ceremony of the Decennial year of Community Radio Sarang at the town hall here on December 1. Prof. Rai said: "The world today is full of ogre type of people who constantly scream and affect the mind. There is very little patience among people today to listen. Even



ryone is eager to talk. In the bargain, there seems to be a dearth of good listeners. A medium such as a community radio like Radio Sarang is helping create such an environment of good listeners giving something refreshing to the mind." Speaking on the occasion, provincial of Karnataka Jesuit Province, Dr (Fr) Stanislaus D'Souza said that it was a great joy to see that Radio Sarang serves the needs of the subaltern communities of Dakshina Kannada

district – particularly places in and around Mangalore. "Most of the listeners are from marginal sections of society. In fact, a sizeable audience of this station are handicapped, many of them blind and some even bedridden.



This decennial is not just of Radio Sarang, it is a celebration of all its listeners," he added. As part of the Decennial celebrations, two physically handicapped listeners of Radio Sarang – Prakash Mangalpaday and Abu Bakkar – were gifted modified two-wheelers. Responding to the gift Mr Mangalpaday said that it was a very kind gesture from Radio Sarang, a community radio station that went beyond merely broadcasting programmes. Twelve deserving people were also given sewing machines at the function and giant umbrellas were given to street vendors. An audio CD of talks on Tulu folklore called 'genada nade' by Tulu scholar Dr Ganesh Amin Sankamar was also released at the function.

Interaction with Dr Pavarala

“Community media makes it possible for the power to be shared rather than it being accumulated in only a few persons. It enables the unrecognized communities to have their own share of spotlight by displaying their music, dialects spoken and gives them an opportunity to showcase their culture,” said Vinod Pavarala, a professor at the department of mass communication, Central University, Hyderabad.

On his visit to St Aloysius College on October 29, Prof. Pavarala shared his valuable insights about Community Radio with the MA Journalism and Mass Communication students. In this informal session he had a detailed informative session about how the community radio is vital in preserving culture and providing identity to various sections of society.

“Despite not having any formal setting, a small country like Nepal has approximately 300 community radio stations whereas India has only around 250,” Prof. Pavarala commented. He highlighted how the community radio helped the marginalised groups of community to have a voice. Be it the Adivasi youngsters who started



with the radio and now have their own YouTube channel, to women from rural background-community radio had always been the channel to their recognition, he said. He also spoke about his extensive experience in the African nations and how the community radio is the lifeline of society there. He made the students aware about the restrictions put on community radio in India, such as it not being allowed to air any news and how the radio overcame these obstacles. “Many stations have of course found a way to circumvent this rule by presenting the news as a discussion between two women or in some cases by even singing the news,” Prof. Pavarala added.

Academia Interaction Series

The Department of MBA, AIMIT conducted Industry Academia Interaction series lecture on 27 November 2019. Dr. Bhamy V Shenoy Energy Consultant and Governing council member of Nitte Engineering College. The lecture was on



“Ecology and environmental protection”.

The session began with a question of how many people are losing their sleep thinking about the environment. As Dr. Shenoy was serving in Houston in the petroleum sector for nearly 30 years he was hoping that the peak demand arrives today so that from there the world would move towards alternative source of energy will be looked upon. Dr. Shenoy spoke on how the world changed rapidly in the past 20-30 years, and the solution to the problem is leading a simpler life. Florence, is a modern in a developed nation with a lot of history they have not widened the road to accommodate more vehicles rather the public is using the public transport system extensively. When the society and each individual in it does his bit, like reduce the use of plastic, increase the use of public transport, avoid use of multiple personal vehicles and plant more trees we can hope for a better planet.

To suggestions or solutions on environmental protection, Dr. Shenoy suggested that it should be through discussions between the younger generation and that old world suggestions cannot be a part of the solution as it limits the thought process. The program concluded with Q&A session.

Faculty Development Programme

Faculty Development Programme for the UG Staff of St Aloysius College (Autonomous) was held from 13 to 17 November, 2019.

On 13th November a one day Program was organized for the newly recruited staff of SAC. The first session by Fr Felix Victor S J, was on POCSO. He created awareness among the staff about One Campus One Policy', forms of child abuse, Protection of women against sexual



harassment at work place as well as the Redressal system. Mr Shimil, College Counselor in his session on Stress Management briefed on the techniques used to handle stress at work place. Dr Vincent Alva, Principal, Milagres College, Kalianpur in his session on the topic 'Learn to Teach and Teach to Learn', gave inputs about teaching techniques and shared his experience as a teacher as well. Post lunch the staff had a outing to Taneerbhavi where they had sharing and games.

On 14 November Sessions were held for all UG staff in five different groups. **First group** of selected staff had two days (14 & 15 November) Workshop on skill development by Professor R Victor, Bengaluru on learning the art of effective communication. It was facilitated with many practical activities.

Group 2- Humanities and languages had first session on Research methodology for Humanities and Languages by Dr Parinitha Shetty, Associate professor, Department of English, Mangalore University, who spoke about the importance of research institutions to be free from any biases and to be accommodative in accepting new indigenous knowledge shared by the marginalized sectors of the society. She spoke on the importance of multidisciplinary approach in Archival Research.

In the Second Session resource person Dr Prasad Pannian, Asso. Prof., Dept. of Comparative Literature, Central University of Kerala spoke on the topic 'Critical Thinking as a Creative Practise'. Dr Pannian spoke about the significance of producing non violent, cohesive knowledge, developed by reflecting on 'self'. He stressed on promoting critical thinking in classrooms and the need for post humanism – encompassing all the living beings.

The Third Session was held by Ms Lugina Miranda, Senior Counsellor, St Agnes College. Ms Miranda highlighted on Coping with stress and the need to control our negative thoughts. She explained the various ways of calming the mind and relaxing when under too much of pressure and also how to become aware of the fact that a negative thought has a physical impact.

Group 3 was for staff of Commerce and Management who had first session on 'Etiquettes for an academician' by Aaron Dsouza. the resource person explained about 'Drama Triangle' which affects the life of the person. He also spoke about the physical and emotional etiquettes which every person must be aware about. Mr. Sachin Tripathi in his session "Artificial Intelligence for Management Education" stressed on the empathetic role of teachers on upgrading the skills to deal with present Context. The application of AI concepts to the academics was fostered. The information provided on tools such as CHAT BOT, ROBO ADVISOR, HERMITIAN was truly useful. The importance of study of analytics in dealing with subjects was emphasized. Next session on "Publishing a quality research paper" by Dr Rajashekhara Pillai focused on essential aspects while writing a quality research paper.

Group 4 comprised of Biological sciences and Chemistry whose first Session by Dr Shyam Prasad focused on the application of animal models in the bioscience research. He emphasized on model *Drosophila melanogaster* (fruit fly) in understanding basic functioning of biological system in animals and its advantages in biological research -both fundamental and advanced research. The second session was on 'How to write quality research articles' by Dr Arun Isloor, Prof of NITK, who gave practical tips of writing a good research paper. He also emphasized on the dangers of plagiarism in writing research paper and mechanism and resources available to avoid plagiarism. The insights on identifying predatory and fake journals were very useful for all new and experienced researchers. The third session by Dr Prakash, focussed on Mycotic maladies of 21st century. The session motivated participants to understand pathogenic fungi in better way.

Group 5 consisted of faculty of Physical sciences and BCA whose first session by Dr Devan, was on "Teaching Methodology and Beyond the edge of Science" He spoke about "The Art of Interactive Teaching and Facilitated Learning". How we can make students Master the topic without teaching and just by being a facilitator. He gave valuable prescriptions for cancer, sharp brain, memory loss, heart attack and many more. Resource person of Session two Dr Suprabha K R, assistant professor, School of Management, NITK. spoke on "Research Methodology". she explained various areas of Research Methodology with examples. Areas of Research, Domain, and Problem setting was discussed. Students have to be encouraged for research related to day to day life. Session three was held by Prof Joselyn F Lobo, associate professor, Roshni Nilaya on Participatory Teaching Methodology. He gave many valuable insights about teaching and learning and also how we need to be good facilitators to our students.

On November 16 two Common sessions were held for the entire UG staff .First session by Rev Fr Joye James SJ on 'Strengths and concerns of Higher Education in Jesuit Institutions' followed by inspirational talk by Dr Shivakumar Magada on 'How to deal with one's Negatives'.

The Faculty development programme held in different groups with the inputs and expertise of various resource persons has helped to recharge the minds of our teachers for better performance of their roles.

The Department of MBA, AIMIT conducted a program on 26 November 2019. Justice N Santhosh Hegde EX Karnataka Lokayukta, carried the session. The talk was on "Upholding moral values and fight against corruption".

The Program began with Mr.Hegde stating how destiny



gives opportunity to those people who are truthful to their responsibility, and considers himself one such individual who was lucky enough to serve people through the roles he has played over the years.

Mr.Hegde said he has visited over 1200 educational institutions since his retirement and has interacted with youth in order to make them understand the importance of being content in one's life and Humanism i.e. is being humane in your dealing with the society. When the society in general ignores this two values they tend to become greedier and corrupt which in turn leads to the failure of a society. Thus, to break the cycle of corruption one needs to awaken the youth towards the idea of a corruption free society.

Scientific Research In Germany: Perspectives And Opportunities

Interactive sessions on the topic “Higher Education And Scientific Research In Germany: Perspectives And Opportunities”, by **Dr. Harish Parala**, Laboratory Manager for MOCVD/ALD labs and Materials Characterization Labs and “Molecular Chemistry Towards Materials Development” by **Dr. Anjana Devi**, Professor, Inorganic Materials Research Group, Ruhr-University, Bochum, Germany was organized on October 16, 2019 at LF Rasquinha Auditorium, St Aloysius College, Mangalore.



The talks were organized by “Alchemy”, the subject association of Department of Post Graduate studies and Research in of Chemistry.

Dr Richard Gonsalves, Director of LCRI Block welcomed the gathering and introduced the resource persons. Dr Ronald Nazareth the Head of the Department of PG Chemistry, Ms Preema Cealla Pais, the President of AL-CHEMY Association, Apoorva S. and Premie Fernandes, Secretaries of ALCHEMY Association were present on the dais.

Dr Harish Parala during his address on “**Higher Education and Pursuing Research in Germany: Perspectives and Opportunities**” elaborated on the education system in Germany and stressed that education is something which they don't compromise on and added that students are more independent in Germany. He gave in depth information on the course named Duetscher Akademischer Austausch Dienst (DAAD), German Academic exchange service - German national agency for international academic cooperation exchange and independent association of universities that provides scholarships and grants along with information and counselling about studying and research in Germany which has 70 regional offices and information centers worldwide. He explained about their degree structure which consists of Bachelor's, Master and PhD. He mentioned that there are more than 250000 international students in Germany with high academic standard. He also spoke about the type of higher Education systems in Germany such as research Universities, universities of applied science and outstanding research institutions. The various procedures to be followed to study abroad, information on scholarship provided for funding to study abroad, internship, or senior thesis research were some other topics he spoke on.

During his talk he gave numerous tips for students to succeed in life and urged students to explore the opportunities to study abroad. He also gave a call for students

to do some sort of quality project during the Master course in their fields of interest, that could help them get a position for PhD in Germany and other European nations.

Dr ANJANA DEVI addressed the gathering on “Molecular Chemistry Towards Materials Development”. During her introductory remark she explained the road to establish oneself as a researcher with the opportunities and barriers during career path. She explained her journey as a researcher reaching to highest position in the university from her humble background of interdisciplinary science which she learnt in material chemistry. She encouraged the students to enter into the research institutes like IISc which shaped her research career and made her competent to face the research world of changing times. Due to her quality post-doctoral research in Ruprescht Karls – universitat, Heidelberg, Germany she got an opportunity to meet the president Alexander Von Humbolt foundation. She also explained her funding paths that enabled her academic career with the habilitation fellowship awarded by Alfried Krupp Von Bohlen and Halbach Foundation in 2020 for the research topic atomic scale engineering of nanostructured functional material; chemical approached totackle challenges in material development as well as her challenges as women researcher especially during the appointment as junior researcher at RUB and stressed the need of optimization of passion and opportunities. On explaining the current research activities she gave an insight on



precursor chemistry and atomic layer deposition on functional materials. Her talk focused on her current research in the field of thin films and the special modifications made in the field of Material research using Rare earth metals especially chemical vapor deposition of Gallium Nitride and the accomplishments in the field of molecular chemistry. She introduced her research group at Ruhr University and highlighted the current areas of research in her lab.

At the end of the talk Dr. Anjana thanked the department of PG Chemistry, organizing committee of Alchemy for giving her an opportunity to express her ideas and also encouraged the budding scientists to work hard towards a definite goal which will surely help them come out with flying colors.

The programme concluded with the vote of thanks proposed by Ms. Elcita. Ms. Tanvi compered the programme.
