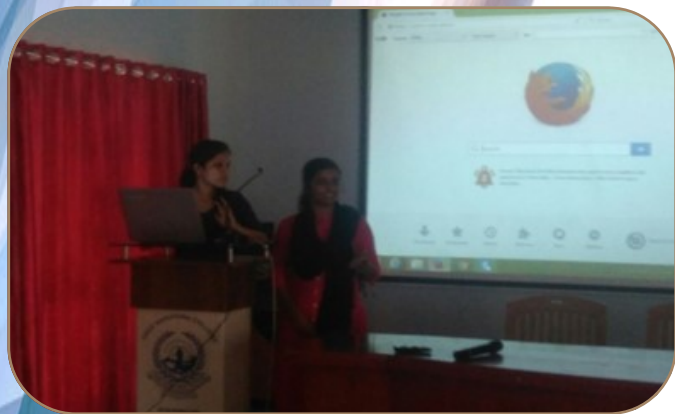

## Industrial Visit - Kalbavi Cashew Industry

**S**t Aloysius College, B.Voc Kaushal Kendra organized an Industrial Visit for the students of the Retail Management on 16<sup>th</sup> February 2017 to Kalbavi Cashew industry.

On prior consent from the authorities and under the guidance of the Director of DDU Kaushal Kendra Rev Dr Praveen Martis SJ, the visit was structured in order to enhance their practical stimulation of students and to let them have an overview on the activities related to producing manufacturing and packaging of the products.

The students along with the faculty members (Ms Sharon Dsouza, Ms Neena Rodrigues, Ms Preema D'Cunha) assembled at the College Campus at 9.50 a.m.



The journey began at 10.00 a.m. via College bus and reached the Kalbavi Cashew industry at 11.00 a.m. Kalbavi Cashews is a leading manufacturer and exporter of Cashew Kernels in South India. It is a registered partnership concern with the partners having an experience of over 5 decades in commodities like cardamom, pepper, Arecanuts, Copra, Food grains, pulses etc. The center has two units one where the raw cashews are dried and kernels are removed and processed.

The dedicated team consisted of about 300 employees among which 95% were women employees. They give primary importance to the hygiene of the working area.

We then visited the second unit where the cashews were bought in bulk and then segregated into two various categories as per the size of the cashews. The cashews were then packed in different types of packages as per the requirement.

The plant was established in the Industrial area of Baikampady on a sprawling one acre land which has a processing facility of about 10000 sqft and also 5000 sqft of warehouse facility. They have a registered office at the heart of the trading center in Bunder.

The processing sector's main focus is on customer needs and currently is catering the niche markets for prime qualities. They have been successful in meeting the stringent quality requirements of a few premium buyers in Europe and Japan. They market these qualities as "Mangalore Specials". They Export their products to Europe & Japan-particularly Mangalore special quality nuts.

Export consignments from Kalbavi Cashews undergo strict inspection by accredited agencies and any consignment found to be not keeping with the prescribed standards are rejected. This measure thus ensures that only the best are exported.

Kalbavi Cashews has been active in the Indian retail Markets since the year 2000. Their products and processes are meeting the modern quality standards like FSSC 22000 system, ISO 22000 and the FSSAI standards which enable them to meet stringent audit and assessment standards of modern large format retail companies with PAN-INDIA presence making their products and brands available throughout the country.

After the visit to both units and then buying the cashew nuts for a discounted price, the team left the premises at 1.00 p.m. It was an informative, interesting and successful visit. As the students of Retail Management it was good exposure to know the various processes and packaging technique. The students also got an insight on how quality checks are carried out at various levels. They were also able to see the various processing equipment's.

## Industrial Visit - Achal Industries and United Breweries.

**A**s a part of curriculum, 34 students of Sociology along with faculty members Ms. Prema D souza and Wilson Fernandes, visited Achal Industries and United Breweries.



The industrial visit enabled the students to know the things practically through interaction. It also provided an opportunity to plan, organize and engage in active learning experiences both inside and outside the classroom.

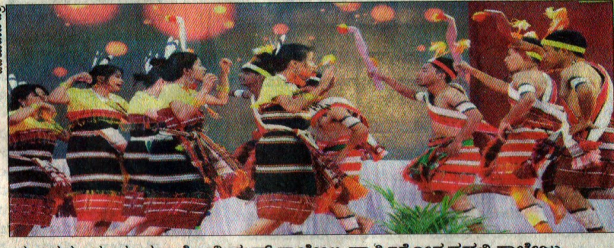
